

Key Terms

Breed – a group of horses having a common origin and possessing certain well-fixed, distinctive, uniformly transmitted characteristics that are not common to other horses

Key Terms

- Light breed/horse average 12-17hh & 900-1,400lbs
- Pony less than 14.2hh, less than 900lbs
- Draft large, average 14.2-17.2hh, over 1,500lbs. Stocky



Thoroughbred

- Found in all solid colors (black is rare)
- ◆ 15.3 17.2 hh Average
- Taller than the Arabian, but maintains fairly lean frame
- "Hot- Blooded" Breed: bred for agility and speed



Thoroughbred

Developed for racing (track – middle distances)

 Conformation emphasizes factors contributing to racing and sports

 Commonly used in many disciplines (ex. jumping, barrel racing, fox hunting, etc.)

Racing speeds around 40mph



Thoroughbred Origins

- Developed in 17th Century England
- Mix of the Darley Arabian, the Godolphin Arabian, and the Byerley Turk, and Curwen's Bay Barb
- Imported to USA in 1730



Physical Features


- Well Chiseled Head
- Long Neck
- High Withers
- Deep Chest
- Slender Body
- Good depth of hindquarters & Long Legs

- The Jockey Club
 - Breed registry for Thoroughbreds in the US and Canada
 - Formed February 1894



Triple Crown

- Started in 1875
- 3 year old Thoroughbreds
- Kentucky Derby
- Preakness Stakes
- Belmont Stakes

- 13 Winners
- Sir Barton: 1st Winner in 1919
- * 1978: Affirmed
- 2015: American Pharoah
- * 2018: Justify
